FEDERAL IMPACT AID SURVEY

What is the Federal Impact Aid Survey?

Impact Aid is a Federal education program that reimburses school districts for lost revenue and additional costs associated with the presence of nontaxable Federal property.

Who should turn in Impact Aid Surveys to the school?

There are three eligible groups. Students with parents who:

- are active duty in the U.S. Military or a foreign military.
- work as a civilian employed on federal property including VA Hospitals, MacDill Air Force Base or other military installations, hotels/casinos on Indian-owned property, federal buildings, courthouses, cemeteries, parks, Army Corps of Engineers projects or other federally-owned property in Florida. A partial list of eligible federal properties is included on the survey form.

How are Impact Aid Funds used?

Impact Aid funds directly impact your child's education by providing funding to replace the loss of property tax revenue that can be used for everyday expenses such as materials, equipment, teachers, special education programming, and building improvements, as part of the general budget of the district.

What can you do to help Hillsborough County Public Schools receive Impact Aid?

Review the form on the back of this flyer carefully to decide if your work or living situation applies to the survey. Complete, sign, and return to your child's school the next school day. Be assured all information is used to support our request for federal funds under the Impact Aid Program.

Why is your survey important?

The amount of funds the school district receives is based on the number of Impact Aid Surveys returned.
